Speech is when you talk with your voice.

hand signs



body language.



Autistic people might like to communicate with

picture cards



a tablet



• a computer.



When you communicate you might want to

• be in a quiet place



• be calm



 have more time to think about what you want to say.

You might like people to know that you communicate with

a computer

your body.

You might want help to decide how to communicate with

your family

your friends

people at work

people you meet.
